The fee of EUR 415,- has to be paid by credit card during online registration.

Those who deregister in writing up until July 1st will have the course fee refunded minus EUR 30,- for administrative costs. Those de-registering after July 1st will not have their fee refunded – unless they find a participant to take their place.

Participants have to write personally to the Internationales Kolleg to make their reservation, indicating "Orff Schulwerk Summer Course" or to Tourismus Salzburg asking for a list of accommodation.

In Progression and on the Spot

By the use of silence as well as the use of stimulating music, we dip into imaginative pathways of *dance-shaping*. This workshop offers the possibility to explore different scores and get tools to create choreographies with a specific focus on spatial aspects. The body in space creates figures, movement pathways and directions. We will create references between two bodies and elements of the room and within group formations. In partner and in group work, each person will be encouraged to create their own little movement phrases according to their individual abilities.

Sing, play and dance –

Music for Kindergarten and primary School

We sing together, create sounds with our bodies, play on Orff Instruments and move our bodies. While playing together, we find ourselves right in the middle of music and dance.

In a simple way, step by step, without noticing it, complex performances are formed. In this class, we take simple musical and dance ideas and learn methods to use them in the kindergarten or primary school context.

Rhythmic Games around the World!

Play is a basic human activity that releases energy, enables creativity and innovation. Rhythm is the natural ordering principle of time and space that gives life dynamics and peace. Coordination training makes it possible to do several things simultaneously.

Creative Classroom: Let's sing and play!

The main principles of Orff Schulwerk—an artistic – educational meeting point—will be introduced through songs, games, movement and active listening to music. This workshop will demonstrate the use of small elements to develop larger forms and unique and interesting outcomes. A combination of Orff Instruments and western classical instruments offer new sounds and possibilities.

Community Music – the Power of the Arts

Everybody is talking about it – but what is *Community Music*? What aspects does it share with Orff-Schulwerk and what approach do teachers need to work with the situation and the participants at hand? A different Approach to classical and contemporary Music – hear, deconstruct, play, compose and move.

Through listening, games, deconstruction of musical scores, singing, playing musical elements and reconstructing them into a new composition, we will approach classical and contemporary music from a different perspective and in doing so, make it more accessible to all. Bring your own instrument along (if possible) and accompany us on a trip to (re-)discover the power of the classical and contemporary music.

Body Percussion and more

The primal instrument, our human body, can create a fascinating orchestra. The various sounds our bodies can produce with feet, hands and our voices create a direct, immediate experience of rhythm. Rhythmic syllables can build a "bridge" to all the patterns and movement we need for playing on and with our bodies. Additional models of improvisation and the freedom of invention promote our creative potential.

Moving Voices, voicing Movement

Everybody has something to say. We can say it with words, with sounds, by singing, by moving, with our bodies and with many other ways of expressing ourselves. According to Orff and his Schulwerk approach, everything starts by creating its own stillness, by becoming aware of our own capacity to listen to our inner selves and by working this out for ourselves and in groups. The main target of this course is to explore different possibilities of our singing, speaking, inner and external voice, which is not to be separated from body and movement, because what moves us internally needs to be defined and given meaning.

Creating Dance Theatre for young Audiences

In this course, we will focus on the needs and elements of a dance theatre piece for children. Free expression, dance-vocabulary, some words and rhythmical action are perfect components to compose a simple story in the most interesting way. Together we will become acquainted with some basic dance improvisation tools and develop playful choreographic ideas. Bert will share his experience as a choreographer of children's pieces with the participants.

Afternoon Workshops

The programme of the workshops lasts the whole week, i.e. five afternoons, 90 mins each. Each participant chooses two workshops.

Because of limited numbers in some groups, during online registration you will be asked to mark a third choice in case your second choice is full.

All classes will be taught in English.

Please bring suitable clothing and shoes for movement sessions.

No video or audio recording is allowed.

Participants will receive a certificate confirming attendance and the amount of the paid fee at the end of the course. Each participant is responsible for his/her medical and accident insurance.
